Cyber Safety Expert to Deliver Helpful Tools at W.G Johnson Centre

Cambridge, Ontario. November 28, 2008... City of Cambridge and the Ontario Government are teaming up to deliver a local information session geared to providing valuable information on safe cyber surfing. An expert in the area of fraud safety and awareness will be coming to the City's W.G Johnson Centre as part of the Active Living Fair entitled "Schemes, Scams and Flimflams". Parents, grandparents, or anyone who spends time on a computer, will benefit from the free presentation.

The event takes place on Thursday, December 4th from 10 am - 3 pm at the Centre located at 31 Kribs Street in Cambridge. The program also includes a free hot lunch.

Funds to deliver the program were achieved through a grant from the Older Adult Centers' Association of Ontario (OACAO) and the Province of Ontario, Ontario Senior's Secretariat. The senior's information and active living fair is a public education initiative, developed in partnership between the Ontario Senior's Secretariat and the OACAO, to increase awareness and knowledge about topics relevant to the community, such as frauds and scams.

The W.G. Johnson Centre is an ideal location for the event and the capacity for the auditorium is 400 which provides plenty of room for people to participate.

"There is a sense of neighbourhood which has made the W.G. Johnson Centre in Hespeler the unique facility that it is. We have programs for all ages," says area recreation manager Paula Ridge. The centre offers pre-school swimming classes, youth leadership, adult fitness classes and computer courses. There's a drop off service for parents to have their children supervised while they attend a workout class. Seniors play an integral part of life at W.G. Johnson Centre, as well. The Ted Wake Lounge offers programs and services Monday to Friday from 9 am to 4 pm geared for the 50 plus crowd. Evening and weekend classes are also offered for adult members.
