This year's juror is Will Gorlitz, professor with the School of Fine Arts & Music at the University of Guelph who has exhibited on the national and international stage including prestigious venues in New York, Montreal and Toronto. A retrospective exhibition of his work organized by the Kitchener-Waterloo Art Gallery entitled 'Nowhere if not here' is currently touring throughout Canada.

"This event celebrates the artistic talents and diversity of the city's creative community. Each year we have organized this exhibition, the prestigious juror has always been very impressed with the depth and skill of the artists of Cambridge. We expect that to be the case again this year as the wealth and breadth of the arts community comes to the fore," says Sophie McCann, Arts Coordinator.

The exhibition runs October 30<sup>th</sup> - November 27<sup>th</sup> with a complementary opening reception, Friday, October 30, 7:00 pm -9:00 pm. The exhibiting artists and juror will be in attendance. There's more than 35 pieces of local art on exhibit and everyone is welcome to attend this very popular event.
