

Milton factory plans move to Cambridge for expansion

CAMBRIDGE — A U.S.-based company has purchased land in Cambridge to move and expand its Milton operations.

Scot Lytton Canada is a supplier and manufacturer of hydraulic power equipment and metal tube. It employs 17 people in Milton in a 20,000 square foot building.

Monday, Cambridge council sold 3.2 hectares of industrial land at 500 Thompson Dr. It's near the Townline Road interchange with Highway 401, south of Pinebush Road.

A new building might start about three times as large as Milton, with room to grow, said Mike Sutton, plant manager in Milton.

Final details about the new Cambridge operation — including how many people might work there — haven't been finalized, he said.

"The land was the first step," Sutton said.

Scot Lytton is part of Scot Industries, a family company founded in 1949. It has eight locations in the U.S. and one in Canada.
