

## Sanitary Sewer System

The City of Cambridge is responsible for the collection of wastewater from residential, institutional, commercial, and industrial sources. The network is made up of pipe, manhole, pumping station, and service lateral assets.

The Region of Waterloo is responsible for the treatment of wastewater at the Preston, Hespeler, and Galt treatment plants and releases treated effluent into the Grand River.
