Thinking of Building a Shed or Deck This Year?
Then You Need To Be Aware of The Following Information

A building permit is required to construct any structure occupying an area greater than 10m² (107 ft.²). If you plan on building a deck, then a building permit is required for any deck that is 60 cm (2'-0") above grade or more. Please note that regardless of requiring a building permit, the City of Cambridge Zoning By-law would still apply. Please contact the City of Cambridge Zoning Division at 519.740.4650 to enquire about the Cambridge Zoning By-law.

To obtain your building permit, bring along two (2) copies of your working drawings (may need qualified designer) indicating size, spans and dimensions, two (2) copies of your site plan indicating location of proposed construction, and the permit fee to:

Are You Planning to Put in a Pool or Hot Tub This Year?
Then You Need To Be Aware of The Following Information

A Swimming Pool and Fencing permit is required for the installation of privately-owned in-ground, on-ground, above-ground and inflatable outdoor pools and hot tubs capable of holding 76.2 cm (30 inches) of water or more.

To obtain your permit, a plot plan or survey of your property is required showing the location of the swimming pool and/or hot tub in relation to the property lines and all structures on the property. The drawing must also show the type of fencing that you intend to use, the location of the fence and any other structures or adjacent fences within 1.5 m (5 feet) of the pool fence.

Notice of Water/Wastewater Long-Range Financial Plan

The delivery of potable in Ontario is regulated by the Ministry of Environment (MOE) under the Safe Drinking Water Act. One requirement under this Act is that all owners of drinking water systems must obtain proper licensing and accreditation to operate and modify their respective systems. As part of the City's license a long-range financial plan for the water system must be produced and made available to the public. The plan also includes a similar approach for the City's wastewater collection system.

The requirements of this report, as dictated by O.Reg. 453/07, are as follows:

- A City Council resolution indicating the drinking water system is financially viable must be approved;
- The plan must indicate that the financial impacts of the drinking water system have been considered;
- It must include details of the proposed financial operations of the system, and;
- It must apply for a period of at least six (6) years.
