**NEW \* Adult Day Services: Offer adults an opportunity for a day out in a safe & caring community setting to socialize, interact, make new friends and have FUN. Volunteers are an integral part of providing these programs to older adults and individuals with challenges..**

Program Locations: Saturday - Allan Reuter Centre, Cambridge; Tuesday - Fairview Mennonite Home, Cambridge; Wednesday & Friday – Christ Anglican Church, Ayr

- **Spanish, Portuguese, Romanian and Russian Speaking Program Aides:** assist Program staff with provision of program activities as well as promotes socialization among participants and assists individuals to complete and actively participate in the daily program. The need for individuals who are able to speak Spanish and English languages are urgently needed for our Tuesday program. - **Food Service Coordinator:** coordinates and oversees the timely preparation of meals and snacks and all functions related to the operation of the kitchen and dining room areas. The food is prepared by our Cook at the Allan Reuter Centre and delivered to the site locations for final preparations. One day per week (9:00 am – 1:30 pm) on a Saturday in Cambridge; Lunch provided.
- **Volunteer Driver:** provides safe transportation for clients to and from the Adult Day Services locations and client's homes throughout Cambridge, North Dumfries Township & Surrounding areas. One day per week on a Saturday in Cambridge; Wednesday or Friday in North Dumfries Township or surrounding areas. Morning pickup between 8:30 & 9:45 and afternoon drop off between 3:00 & 4:15.
