



## OTHER FILM PROJECTS

- **Urban Legends**, a popular T.V. series for the History Channel filmed an episode in west Galt on December 12, 2010. Cineflix (Legends 3) Inc. shot interior scenes at a private residence.
- **Committed Productions Inc.** filmed a few exterior driving scenes on the Parkhill Road bridge for a suspense thriller. Cameras were located in Mill Race Park and on the Parkhill Road Lookout. Filming took place on Fri. Dec. 3, 2010.
- **Cineflix (Dual Suspects) Inc.**, a Toronto Production Company filmed various fire scenes at the Cambridge Fire Dept, Station No. 1 for an upcoming investigative crime show to be aired on the Discovery Channel and the History Channel. The episodes focus on true crimes that happened in the past. On Thursday, September 23, 2010, the Cambridge Fire Dept. staff co-ordinated and worked with the Production Company on the various fire sequences required for filming.
- A new series being produced for TV Ontario was filmed at the Hespeler Memorial Arena on June 23, 2010. The film series consists of the making of ice skates, the making of hockey sticks and how these items are used. The scenes at the arena consisted of filming a group of young people playing hockey where ice skates and hockey sticks are in use.

## **OTHER FILM PROJECTS (con'd)**

- **Daytime Rogers TV taped a Cambridge segment in Mill Race Park on June 2, 2009. The program will air several times over the summer months. Some segments included interviews on the new Cambridge City Hall; School of Architecture; Cambridge Arts; the BIA's; a cooking demonstration; and a fashion show.**
- **Discovery Channel Canada filmed one segment of a new series titled "How Machines Work" at the Cambridge Fire Department Headquarters on March 31, 2009. The Fire Department Training Staff worked with the film crew in regards to the operation of an aerial fire truck and other equipment. The series produced by HMW Productions Inc. will be aired in 2010.**
- **Sheridan College students filmed at City Hall, 50 Dickson Street in November 2008. The students utilized the third floor Planning Services counter as the backdrop for their various film sequences.**
- **The T.V. series "Til Debt Do Us Part" filmed several scenes for the show in Cambridge in October, 2008. The hedge at the edge of Mountview Cemetery (Grant St. @ Kenmore Ave.) and Mill Race Park were used as the backdrops for the lifestyle scenes. The host of the show, Gail Vaz-Oxlade was in Cambridge for various film sequences.**
- **In April 2008, third year Media Arts students from Sheridan College of Technology and Advanced Learning filmed on the river walkway in Mill Race Park and the Main Street bridge. The film project was part of the course curriculum for the students.**



## **OTHER FILM PROJECTS (con'd)**

- In August 2007, The Old Hide House - Acton Leather Company used the backdrop of Mill Race Park for a fashion photo shoot for their leather wear.
- A fourth year filming student from Ryerson University in Toronto filmed some sequences as part of his thesis film project. Cambridge locations included Churchill Park and Mill Race Park. Filming took place in early January, 2007.
- The Weather Network filmed a segment of "Out and About" in various areas of Cambridge in August, 2006. The film segment will feature Cambridge, Ontario in its Friday airings.
- Sheridan College students from Toronto filmed a small film project at St. Clement's Church on Duke Street (Preston) in March, 2005.
- The Babcock & Wilcox Company, headquartered in Ohio, filmed part of an employee training video at its Babcock & Wilcox Canada location at 581 Coronation Boulevard in January, 2005.
- The Vineyard Christian Fellowship of Cambridge filmed a training video in May, 2003 at the School of Architecture located on Melville Street.
