NOTICE OF COMPLETION
SCHEDULE "B" CLASS ENVIRONMENTAL ASSESSMENT
AND PRELIMINARY DESIGN STUDY
GUELPH AVENUE FROM NORTH OF MILTON AVENUE TO SOUTH OF HESPLER ROAD
CITY OF CAMBRIDGE

The City of Cambridge has completed a Class Environmental Assessment Study for improvements to the road corridor on Guelph Avenue from Milton Avenue to south of Hespeler Road (Regional Road #24). This study investigated storm, sanitary and water servicing upgrades; drainage, utility and street lighting improvements; intersection configuration amendments, and improvements to the existing road cross section.

This study was completed in compliance with a Schedule "B" undertaking following the requirements of the Municipal Engineers Association, Class Environmental Assessment for Municipal Roads, Water and Wastewater Projects (as amended), and identified a preferred alternative. The preferred alternative, referred to as Option 3A, is a three lane urban cross-section with bike lanes from Scott Avenue to Poplar Drive and a two lane urban cross-section with bike lanes from Poplar Drive to Black Bridge Road. The entire section is to include sidewalks on both sides of the right-of-way, installation of new watermain and storm sewer systems, and minor adjustments to the sanitary sewer system. An Environmental Study Report has been prepared and is available for public review at the following locations:

If concerns regarding this project cannot be resolved in discussion with the municipality, a person may request that the Minister of the Environment make an order for the project to comply with Part II of the Environment Assessments Act (referred to as a Part II Order), which addresses individual environmental assessments. Requests must be received by the Minister at the address below by May 20, 2008. A copy of the request must also be sent to the City of Cambridge, Clerks Department. If no request is received by May 20, 2008, the project will proceed to construction as outlined in the Environmental Study Report.
