



## THE RESCUERS: STORIES OF COURAGE

Filming portions of one episode of "The Rescuers: Stories of Courage" took place in downtown Cambridge (Galt) on lower Main St.; Queen's Square, and the Main Street Bridge in 1997.



The "Rescuers" consists of three films, each comprised of two one-hour true stories involving the courageous efforts of non-Jews who risked their lives to rescue victims of the Holocaust.

Based on the books "Rescuers: Portraits of Moral Courage in the Holocaust" by Gay Block and Malka Drucker;

"Mamusha" written by Susan Nanus; and "Woman on a Bicycle" by Ernest Kinoy.

The first two-hour program titled "Two Women" starring Elizabeth Perkins was partially filmed in downtown Cambridge.

"Two Women" is the story of Gertruda Babilinska, a Polish housekeeper who devoted her life to protecting and saving the lives of Jewish men, women and children in Europe during the Holocaust years, 1939-1945.
