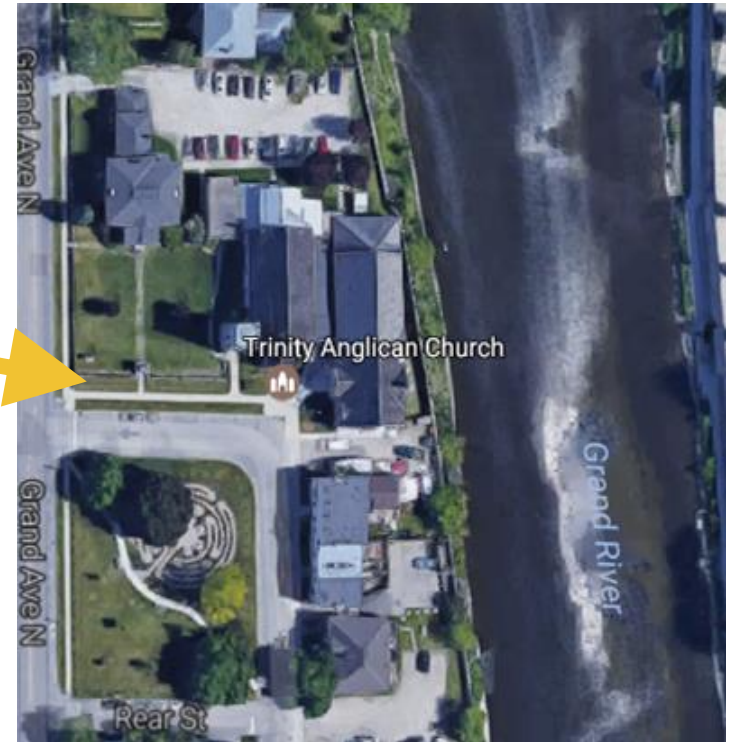

Trinity Anglican Church: Cambridge



Research

Our Findings

- Trinity Anglican was **not interested** in adaptively reusing their building
- Most **influential** service provided
 - The Community Table

Trinity Anglican Church:

- Trinity is doing well financially
- Has a strong and healthy congregation (~200 members)

We have addressed the request for proposal by recommending the intensification of Trinity's services to the community



Case Study

The Working Centre

- Created in response to poverty and unemployment in downtown Kitchener
- A non for profit social service for 30 years
- Provide numerous services and assistance programs
 - Access to housing and technology
 - Food Programs
 - Hacienda Sarria Market Garden
 - Maurita's Kitchen
 - St. John's Kitchen

Implications	Next Steps
<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Fosters an environment for cooking within the church● Gets everyone in the community involved● Minor risk with beginner cooks	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Schedule a the space with the church● Hire volunteers to run the events● Hire expert chef to instruct the cooking lessons

Community garden

- Fresh food for The Community Table

Implications	Next Steps
<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Potentially be inaccessible to the greater community● Provide fresh food for the community table● Connects community	<ul style="list-style-type: none">● Finalize the plot of land● Have a group of people maintain the garden

Implications	Next Steps
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Participation would cost money• Instructor is required for activity• Only caters to a certain group of people• Parking spaces	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• May require rezoning• Look at requirements for hosting a PaintNite• Advertise the event



Escape Room

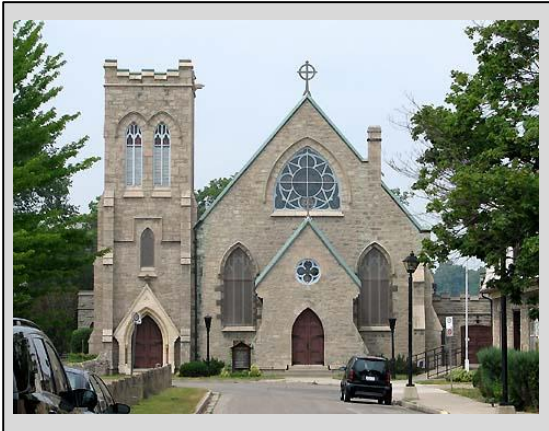
Implications	Next Steps
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Attracts a younger audience to the church• The church would need to run the program itself	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• May require rezoning• Ensure that idea aligns with church values• Select a room in which it could be done

- Unite the church, the city and the community.

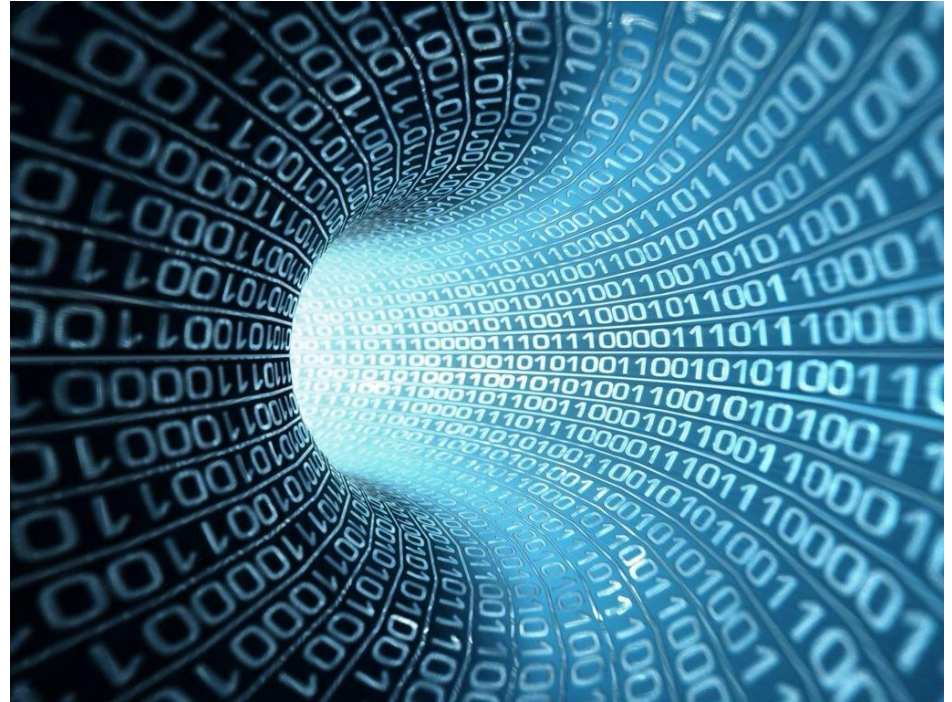
