What is *Moving Cambridge*?

A plan for Cambridge's transportation system that supports sustainable growth of the city, through the efficient movement of people and goods.

The Challenge

Cambridge is growing. Continued investment in transportation is needed to limit congestion, improve access to transit, and support walking and cycling.

The Plan

Moving Cambridge provides investments and policies to manage the transportation system and support a healthy community. To meet its goal, *Moving Cambridge* recommends:



Enhance Active Transportation Facilities

to support walking and cycling



Support for ION LRT Stage 2

between Cambridge and Kitchener



6 intersection improvements

to enhance traffic flow, and pedestrian and road safety

Community Input

Community input and feedback was collected a variety of ways (at public meetings and events, and online), and was used to shape the plan.

The Goal

Moving Cambridge seeks to achieve sustainable growth through the support of all travel modes – walking, cycling, transit and vehicles, while reducing dependency on single occupant vehicle trips.



Support for a new Coronation iXpress Route

(by Grand River Transit) along King St, Coronation Blvd, and Ainslie St



8 truck route changes

to improve connections, and avoid residential and busy areas



12 road widenings

to accommodate additional vehicle lanes, and walking and cycling facilities in growing areas

The Process

The Transportation Master Plan was conducted in accordance with the master planning process following the requirements of Phases 1 and 2 of the *Municipal Class Environmental Assessment* process (October 2000, as amended in 2007, 2011 and 2015), which is an approved process under the Ontario *Environmental Assessment Act*. The plan addresses need and justification at a broad level and recommended infrastructure projects will require further detailed studies as per the *Municipal Class Environmental Assessment* process.
