

Thank you to everyone who participates in those events. The positive feedback and support from the participants inspire us to be excited about the future of the Ted Wake Centre.

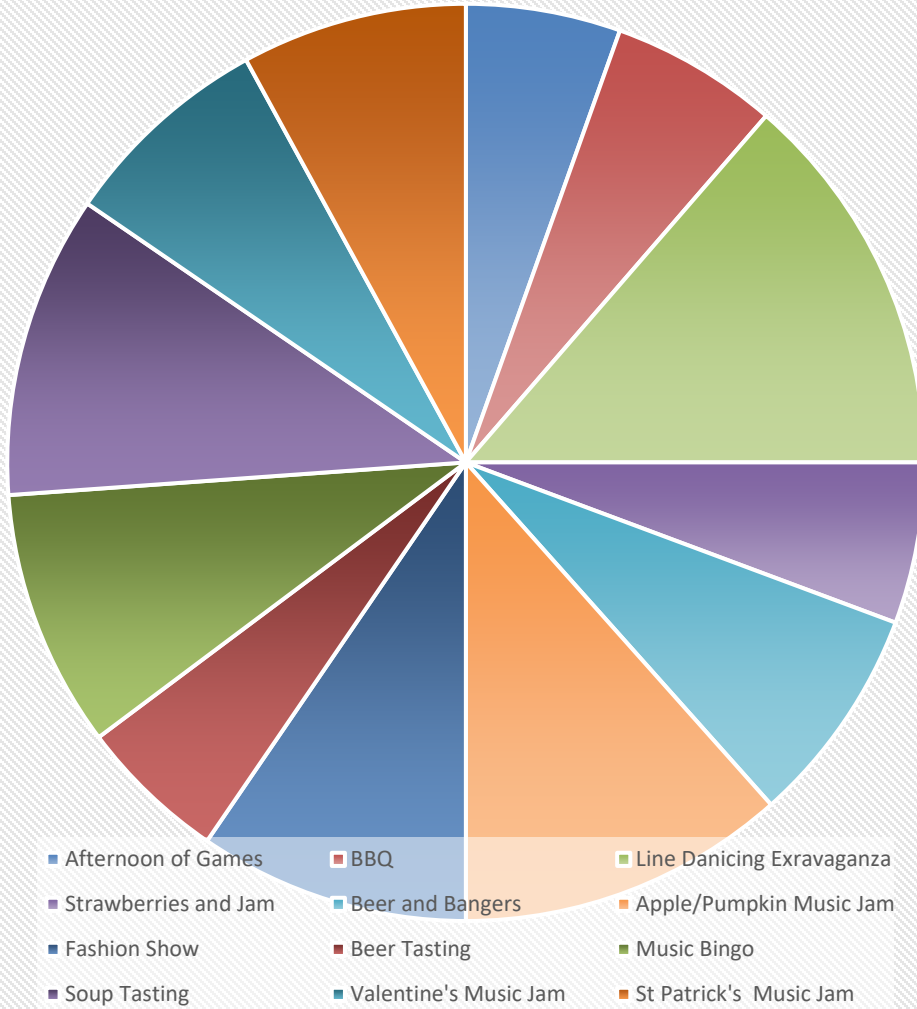

# Club Reports

## **Ancient Mariners Canoe Club (AMCC) Report 2023-2024**

The summer of 2023 was a busy one for the Club with weekly paddles, primarily on the Grand River, along with social events including the Strawberry Social, an evening paddle and BBQ dinner, Potluck Picnic and Corn Roast. The Club also took a number of seniors out on the water on chairs mounted between 2 connected canoes. This was an outing enjoyed by all. The Club participated in Cambridge's program to attract new doctors, taking a number of medical students out on the Grand to show them this attractive feature of the City.

The fall of 2023 and winter of 2024 saw weekly hikes and bowling activities. A Christmas lunch was organized for Club members in early December and there was a hike and hotdog lunch event for members and their grandkids during the March break.

The Club continued to undertake river cleanups in the fall of 2023 and spring of 2024 covering both sides of an extensive section of the river. The Club rewards members with a hot lunch after gathering many bags of garbage to help keep the City and the Grand River clean.

In October the Club accepted 8 new members, bringing total membership to 132. Training and safety sessions for new members as well as current members, started in March 2024 with dryland, first aid and pool training and finally on river paddles at the end of April. Intermediate and advanced training sessions for a limited number of members took place in May 2024 with several very experienced members taking the lead.

The Secretary of the Club, along with a small committee, undertook an extensive review and revision of the Director's Handbook. The revised version has been presented to and approved by the Board and is currently with the City for final approval.



Other activities taken on by the Club's members include work on the Lisaard house gardens, maintaining the Cambridge Pollinator Preserve, helping with the Canada Day parade, organizing the Bondi and Chesley Lake get-aways, and loan of the boathouse to **rare** for their trail party fund raiser.

The Club holds an annual garage sale fundraiser to build and maintain the reserve fund that ensures the Club is able to maintain safe and effective equipment. In February 2024 the Club's Board approved the purchase of 2 new canoes and the sale of 3 old ones. The new canoes have been received and are already being used for weekly paddles. Overall the Club's equipment is in good working condition.

The Club is in a healthy financial position and continues to bring its members together for outdoor exercise and lively social and volunteer activities.
