

RECOGNITION FOR ARTS & CULTURAL ACHIEVEMENT POLICY

ELIGIBILITY

To be eligible for cultural recognition individuals, or groups, must be:

- A resident of the City of Cambridge, and/or
- An associated member, employee, or student of a artistic or culturally relevant group or school in the City of Cambridge

RECOGNITION CATEGORIES

Included in the scope of consideration:

Communication/Literary Arts

Refers to using the written word or spoken word in prose or verse, or visual presentation in one of the many vehicles of communications; radio, play writes, television, newspaper or other printed works.

Music

Refers to instrumental and vocal. Included under this heading are songwriters, musicians, singers, etc.

Performing Arts

Refers to plays, musicals, dance or film. Included under this heading are the directors, producers, performers etc.

Visual Arts

Refers to drawing, painting, printmaking, fine crafts (such as clay, glass, textile, leather, etc.), sculpture, puppetry, photography, etc.

AWARDS

Individuals

Outstanding Artistic/Cultural Achievement - Plaque with Crest

- Citizens that have won, placed second, or third in a provincial, national, or international Competition, sanctioned by a governing body for their art
Citizens that have been recognized for their art through national, or international acclaim, or acceptance into an accredited national school

Emerging Artist Award - Certificate

- Citizens that have won, placed second, or third in a regional competition for their art

Groups/Organizations

Outstanding Artistic/Cultural Achievement - Plaque with Crest

- Groups of citizens that have placed first in a provincial, national, or international competition, sanctioned by a governing body for their art

Emerging Artists Award - Certificate

- Groups of citizens that have won, placed second, or third in a regional, competition for their art

INTERPRETATION

Sanctioned means:

The artist or artistic group must have been selected based on performance by a Canadian, Provincial or National governing body.

Accepted means:

The Artist must have been selected, based on performance, to attend the school.

Accredited means:

To be recognized (by an institution of learning) as maintaining those standards requisite for its graduates to gain admission to other reputable institutions of higher learning or to achieve credentials for professional practice.
